Dear Neighbor,

At Washington Gas, we work every day to safely and reliably meet the energy needs of our customers. Today, natural gas is the fuel of choice for more than nine out of ten new homebuyers in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, and Washington Gas serves more than 1.2 million customers throughout the region. As our region continues to grow, expansion and rehabilitation of our existing infrastructure is critical to maintaining our natural gas distribution system. As part of the Prince George's County and District of Columbia Reliability and Reinforcement Project (PGCDCRRP), Washington Gas will soon be performing work in your area. This work will not affect the natural gas service to homes or businesses.

# This is an update to the Phase 5 construction notice dated October 22, 2021.

#### Construction Overview - Phase 5

This phase of the project extends from Harry S. Truman Drive just north of New Orchard Drive, through Southwest Branch Valley Stream Park, and through private property easements to the intersection of Largo Drive West & Lottsford Road just north of Central Avenue (MD-214). For this phase of the project, construction area preparation is complete and construction activities are underway. Phase 5 work is now anticipated to be complete in late Summer or early Fall 2022 followed by restorations. Work will typically occur Monday through Saturday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Construction schedules may be affected by weather and other unforeseen circumstances. All work will be completed in accordance with permits.

## What Can I Expect During Construction?

Please follow traffic control signs on Harry S. Truman Drive and the ramp from 495 to Central Avenue for lane closure information. If you live near the construction area, you may feel and hear construction during work hours, and you can expect to see Washington Gas and contractor vehicles and equipment. For your safety and the safety of construction personnel, do not cross construction barriers, enter construction areas, or approach vehicles or equipment.

# Special Notice for Residents Adjacent to Work Area on New Orchard Drive

Due to ground conditions in the area north of New Orchard Drive between Harry S. Truman Drive and Cedarhollow Lane, a specific type of excavation stabilization is required for worker safety which is installed and removed using vibration methods. All work activities use standard stabilization and construction methods and are expected to be well below accepted safety and

structural vibration thresholds, however vibration may be felt and will be monitored continuously in this area as a peace-of-mind courtesy for adjacent neighbors. Adjacent residents with questions or noise consideration requests are invited to contact the project team.

### **About the PGCDCRRP Project**


Washington Gas is constructing new infrastructure in Prince George's County and the entire region.

The investment will include approximately 16 miles of coated steel, natural gas pipeline and regulating stations connecting two portions of Washington Gas' existing system.
